**FROM THE PASTOR**

The Psalms offer up a poem for every season and setting.  
Search and you will find every life experience and emotion there.  
Study the rich vocabulary and borrow words to help you pray.

As summer turns to fall, imagine bits of cotton that fall alongside the roads when trucks take cotton to the gins. And picture behind many a Natchez house and in unexpected places around our community, gardens that are ripe with fruits and vegetables that do not give up until the first frost comes.

How blessed we are to live in a place so bountifully erupting in God's goodness – lakes and rivers, bluffs and rolling hills – a land of fertile soil and towering trees, of awe-inspiring sunsets and sunrises.

As the earth tilts and the sunlight takes on its autumn slant, explore the joyful words of praise found in Psalm 65, especially these:

"You crown the year with your bounty; your wagon tracks overflow with richness. The pastures of the wilderness overflow, the hills gird themselves with joy, the meadows clothe themselves with flocks, the valleys deck themselves with grain; they shout and sing together for joy." (vv. 11-13)

With its joyful praise of God for creating the bountiful earth, this psalm also offers reminders of God's care of our souls, bending to bathe us in forgiveness when we succumb to thoughts or deeds outside God's bounds:

"When deeds of iniquity overwhelm us, you forgive our transgressions ... By awesome deeds you answer us with deliverance, O God of our salvation." (vv. 3 & 5)

Make Psalms a regular stop in your day when you pause for prayer or meditation. Share the joy and lament found there. Experience God's mighty power rising in front of you: "By your strength you established the mountains; you are girded with might" (v. 6). And sense God's loving kindness touching your heart: "O you, who answer prayer! To you, all flesh shall come" (v. 2).
