



In the course of many revisions, the original eucharistic emphasis of this text has shifted to a hymn of thanksgiving for a wide range of human experience, with a Christological summation. It is set here to the tune that is customary in North America, though not elsewhere.

Music Notes: The music this morning is pre-recorded from the organ as our Director of Music is away. Special thanks to Jay Fitch who is managing the recordings from the console. The Prelude is a lovely *Allegro* by British composer Sameul Wesley (1766-1837). The Organ Solo during the Offertory is *Andante con moto* by French organist and composer Alexandre Guilmant (1837-1911). The Postlude is a short *Fughetta on Komm, Heilger Geist (Come, Holy Ghost)* by German baroque composer Andreas Armsdorf.
